March Program

The March Wildwood Historical Society program, *Oysters to Angus: Three Generations of the St. Louis Faust Family*, will be presented by Elizabeth Terry. Elizabeth was raised on a cattle ranch on the Wyoming/Nebraska line, and it was there that she developed her love for history, walking along old wagon ruts on the spacious prairie to go work cattle in log corrals just as her ancestors had done. She received a history degree from the University of Nebraska-Kearney and a Master's in Public History from James Madison University in Virginia. After Elizabeth's young daughter was diagnosed with a severe, debilitating illness, her focus shifted from library and museum work to the more flexible pursuit of writing and research. Elizabeth's passion for pioneer spirit was channeled into the publication of *Oysters to Angus*, a fascinating read on raw issues that troubled the Faust family and other German-Americans in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries in St. Louis. The book provides a scholarly, fresh approach to pivotal events in our city's history. This must-read book and program will give a wealth of new, well-researched information to everyone from the novice history lover to the experienced history buff. 

Peek Into Our Past

The *Watchman* county newspaper published news from towns in our area in the late 1800s. Enjoy this month's "Peek Into Our Past."

3/8/1883 – Wednesday last a wood-chopping came off at Mr. Keller's place on Wild Horse Creek. Nearly half-hundred axes with the necessary motors attached to them, were busy from morning until night, and Mr. Keller's beaming face indicated perfect satisfaction. A splendid dinner and supper was served and Mrs. Keller spared no pains to secure the best of everything. The ever ready violin, the eagerly waiting ladies and the refreshed choppers were at last set to work again, and it was surprising to see what graceful motions were made in the never ending quadrille. All were happy; even those, who were unfortunate enough to be detained until 3 o'clock, a.m., assured that they had "a big time". And Mr. Keller looked at the cracks in the floor the next morning.

3/27/1885 – A boy arrived at the residence of Mr. Thos. Richardson with the intention of making his future home there. His principal business the next 12 months will be to milk. He weighs 11 lbs.

3/26/1886 – Geo. Brown, whose horses strayed away about a week ago, has through the instrumentality of Mr. Frank Taylor, of Pond, Mo., recovered said horses. They are supposed to have been ridden to St. Louis and then turned loose, and were caught by Mr. Sudmacher, 12th and Geyer Avenue, and held until found by Mr. Taylor on Saturday morning, March 20th.

3/9/1888 – The weather is changeable and variable to a most astonishing degree, the thermometer being way up in the sixties Wednesday and Thursday of last week, and the little froggies pipeing in the ponds, and to-day at freezing point and snowing. Wheat, however, notwithstanding the severe freezes and thaws, looks quite promising in this vicinity. It is said not to look quite so well south of here on Manchester road, owing presumably to the causes above stated, and the greater exposure to the northwest winds, as that locality is high and hilly, which gives the cold winds a fair sweep over their north slope and along their summits.

3/23/1888 – The stores of Henry Hanken, at Dutch Hollow, and Fred Hanken, at Fox Creek, were entered by burglars on Tuesday night of last week, who carried off a lot of knives, combs and other small articles.
